Equality advocates express concerns about Whittlesea book ban plan

The Victorian Pride Lobby's Rainbow Local Government campaign is concerned about the stance held by a slate of candidates running in the upcoming Whittlesea City Council elections led by Aidan McLindon, former Deputy Leader of the far-right Freedom Party.

McLindon and his group of candidates are pushing for books containing information on sexuality to "be withdrawn" from public libraries. This blatant attempt to censor LGBTIQA+ content has sparked outrage from equality advocates.

"Our libraries must remain safe spaces for diverse ideas and beliefs where everyone is seen, heard, and valued," said Dr. Sean Mulcahy, co-lead of the Rainbow Local Government campaign.

"People have the right to choose which library books they read and borrow and which library events they attend—without interference."

This latest attack on LGBTIQA+ inclusion comes in the wake of a <u>failed attempt</u> by Cumberland City Council (NSW) to impose a similar book ban.

"Parents and children should be able to enjoy a welcoming and supportive environment in their local library—not fear censorship or exclusion," Dr. Mulcahy emphasised.

"Books help foster imagination and learning, and LGBTIQA+ books can help foster diversity, inclusion and acceptance.

"We must fiercely oppose any attempt to ban LGBTIQA+ books from public spaces."
